RNLI Water Safety Sessions

Last week, Sally Benwell, a volunteer from the RNLI spoke to Fox, Squirrel and Otter classes. (She had visited already Hedgehog class in January). She talked about the importance of water safety when visiting rivers, lakes, reservoirs and the coast and what to do if someone got into difficulties. The children listened well and Sally commented on how engaged they were with the discussions. Thank you to Sally for giving up her day to visit us and talking to us about the work of the charity.

Reversible and Irreversible Reactions Experiment

In Otter class, the children really enjoyed doing some practical experiments to support their learning in Science about reversible and irreversible reactions. This included putting vinegar into a small bottle and bicarbonate of soda into a balloon. The balloon was placed over the top of the bottle and the bicarbonate of soda fell into the vinegar. A chemical reaction took place and carbon dioxide was released. This inflated the balloon. Ava T said "It was a really fun experiment", Frank said "I was worried the vinegar would go all over me but it was Ok" and Dottie N said "It was interesting to see how big the balloons got. More bicarbonate of soda meant the balloon got bigger. Lots of carbon dioxide was produced".

The children also learnt about reversible reactions, such as salt mixing with water.
